## From the Rector

Hello all!

Lately, I have had several folks come to me to learn about the discipline of meditation and to learn how to begin their practice of centering their lives in a new way. *This hunger for something more, for something that is practical and actually helps them make it through the day with some peace, is something being felt all across our church, and, indeed, our world.*

Early Christians realized they held citizenship in more than one reality: they were citizens of the Roman Empire and of the Kingdom of God. They sought to form themselves as dual citizens, learning how to exhibit the resurrected life of Christ in the midst of the realities of taxes, wars, and death. European cultures, and those whose Christian understanding derives from them, decided to merge the state and the church, to create a unified citizenship, where duty to the church and state were identical. It can be argued whether or not that ever succeeded, but in the last several hundred years that blending of church and state has all but ended, even if many of us behave as if it still persists.

We now live in post-Christendom, where issues of authority in the church differ from those in our culture at large. So, how do we live again as citizens of two worlds?

Our first obligation is to be citizens of the Kingdom of God, and we are called to once again pattern our lives according to the ancient practices so that our citizenship in the Kingdom of God is visible and undeniable. In the experiences of the first generations of Christians, the church adopted, among others, seven ancient patterns of living. It was through their wholesale embracing of these patterns of living that they changed not only the courses of their own lives, but of the entire world.

So what are those seven ancient patterns of living? Over the next several months, I will write about them here in my article for the *Eagle Notes*. Three of these patterns of living deal with governing the body/mind/soul, and four with governing the hours of our lives.

The first of the ancient practices is

The first of the ancient practices is **tithing**:

- In every system of life, every citizen pays into the common life of all.
- We must give back to whatever community in which we live, both the church and the state.
- It is the foundational spiritual practice of giving one tenth of our treasure to the maintenance of our common life as the church that sets our feet on the path of learning to trust in the sufficiency of the Lord, of growing beyond our narrow regard for ourselves, and of seeing the hand of God at work in our lives and in the world around us.
- All the other spiritual patterns for developing a life of meaning, stability, and purpose flow from this foundational practice!

As our new church program season begins, I challenge every one of us to begin to undertake this most vital spiritual pattern for living, perhaps beginning with annually increasing your giving proportionally until you live into the tithe. The faithful practice of tithing will absolutely change your life! Living into the tithe will challenge many, if not all, of our assumptions about how much we actually need to live a happy and healthy life, and we will discover greater peace as we are liberated from our obsessive need to possess. Living fully into the tithe will open your heart, eyes, and mind to a life of deeper awareness of the love of God, and to a deeper life of compassion, mercy, and joy!

With the help of the Lord, we all can do it, and open the gates of the kingdom in our lives and our community!

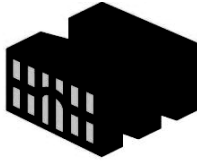

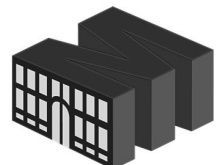
The Main Street Academy opened Monday, August 23, 2010, in the Education Wing of our church. It's an exciting time for the school and for us. There's a whole new breath of fresh air in our church, and it's coming from a large group of young children! Listed below are some of the facts concerning the school. If you have other questions, please do not hesitate to contact either **David Houser** (david\_houser@att.net) or **Kei Breedlove** (kei.breedlove@gmail.com) who can provide the answer or get it for you

- We welcomed 220 plus children in kindergarten and first grade. They were joined by 22 teachers.
- It's a long school day for them. School begins with breakfast in Bott Hall, as early as 7:00 a.m., and the classrooms start their activity at 8:00 a.m. with school ending at 4:00 p.m. For approximately 70 of these children, there is after-school fun and learning, with an afternoon snack served in Bott Hall from 4:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. These children will return to their classrooms and end their day at 6:00 p.m. — a long day for these little ones!
- The school occupies both floors of our Education Wing, and we share space with them (common space) in our administrative corridor and Bott Hall.
- Their own janitorial staff will clean continuously, but with an all-day focus on Bott Hall.

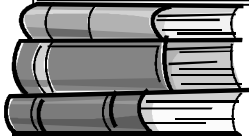
O Eternal God, bless all schools, colleges, and universities especially The Main Street Academy housed here in the St. John 's Education Wing, that they may all be lively centers for sound learning, new discovery, and the pursuit of wisdom.

Loving God, You guided your Son, Jesus, to the temple to grow and learn. Bless all those who teach and those who learn as they begin this new school year, and grant that they may find you to be the source of all truth. Comfort also the parents who love and support these beloved children and who miss them while they are at school. Keep them safe in Your loving arms, no matter where they are. Bless their children, and bring them all together at the end of the day, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen!

- Their traffic pattern will have children dropped off and picked up at the side door of our church on Hardin Avenue (Parish House side). But if the weather is terribly inclement, they may drop children in our horseshoe parking area so they can use the covered entrance. If they do this, they know they cannot block the parking lot to our church staff or members.
- Teachers' parking has been established in the parking lot across the street from the church and along Hardin Avenue.
- The charter school doors will remain locked at all times, unless children are moving with their teachers. There are many security agreements in place, all designed to protect the children.
- To comply with safety concerns regarding the school children, we can no longer receive people unknown to the parish looking for assistance without a prior appointment made through the church office.
- We have established two tentative dates when our church members can tour the school and see what has happened in our old Education Wing. We will announce those dates soon.
- The Main Street Academy has invested over \$300,000 in bringing our building up to code and making it a wonderful place to teach children. That's great for us in the long run.
- Main Street's lease with us is for two years, with an option to extend for the third year. The lease payments and operating cost-sharing put us in a very strong financial position throughout the term of the lease.
- And finally, the arrival of all these children and teachers will not affect our worship life at all, and we will in no way have our access to the church restricted. Our regular programs, such as AA, Wednesday Night Bible Study, Begin Again, etc., will continue as before.

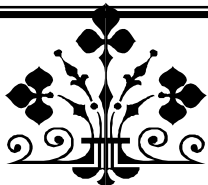

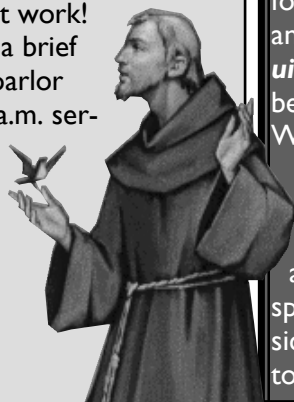

My wife, our two children, and I are very thankful for your generous Theological Education Grant, which has eased the financial burden of my seminary education. While I have met only a handful of you, with God and Fr. Troy willing, I hope to be able to visit St. John's sometime this year.

For those of you who don't know me, my name is Josh Bowron. My wife Brittany and I have been married 8 years. We have two children, Ava (5) and Henry (3). Currently, I am about to start my senior year at Sewanee. I am the student body president and I serve as a sacristan at the seminary's Chapel of the Apostles. 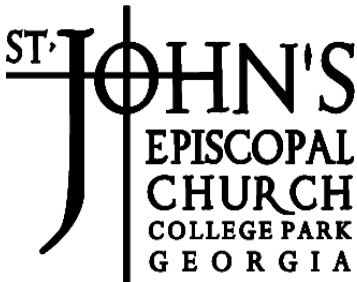
Far be it from me to glory

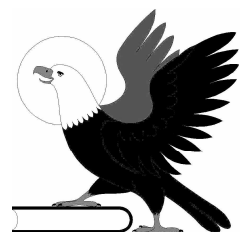
